Developmental Disabilities Awareness Day

The first time I experienced **Developmental Disabilities Awareness**



Day (DD Day) I was amazed at all the supports and information that were available for individuals with disabilities, their families and professionals. The exhibit room held over 100 providers of service, equipment, support and recreation who were available to talk to families, professionals and selfadvocates. The workshops had so many topics I didn't know how to choose. Jessica, my daughter, was born with severe developmental disabilities and she was my initial reason for entering the special education field. I went to DD Day 1998 wearing my Early Childhood Direction Center (ECDC) professional hat, but I left wearing two hats: parent and professional.

Fast-forward to 2012 and the 24th Annual Developmental Disabilities Awareness Day. This year the event has moved from its former location to The Conference Center Niagara Falls, 101 Old Falls Street, Niagara Falls, NY. It still has many workshops and providers of service available to talk to families.

The keynote speaker is Zach Anner a comedian and cultural satirist born in Buffalo, New York. He has a condition known as cerebral palsy. After graduating from high school with honors and a GED, Zach attended college at the University of Texas at Austin. There he worked on the sketch comedy show "That's Awesome," the mocumentary show "The Wingmen," and the documentary "Forgotten Lives." Through his website: therealzachanner.com, Zach has released several witty online videos causing him to become an Internet phenomenon. Zach gained worldwide attention with his submission of a video to "Your OWN Show: Oprah's Search for the Next TV Star" competition. After participating in the competition Zach won his own travel show on OWN. Singer-musician John Mayer endorsed Zach from the beginning and wrote an original theme song for Zach's new show. On "Rollin' With Zach," he travels the country, pushing his limits as he tries everything from surfing to rock climbing. And when things don't go as planned, Zach embraces the problem with his sharp sense of humor and a positive attitude. because he believes life is an adventure and sometimes you just have to "roll with it."

Western New York is fortunate to have this annual event. This year DD Day will be held **Thursday, May 24**th **2012,** from 8:00am-4:00 pm.
