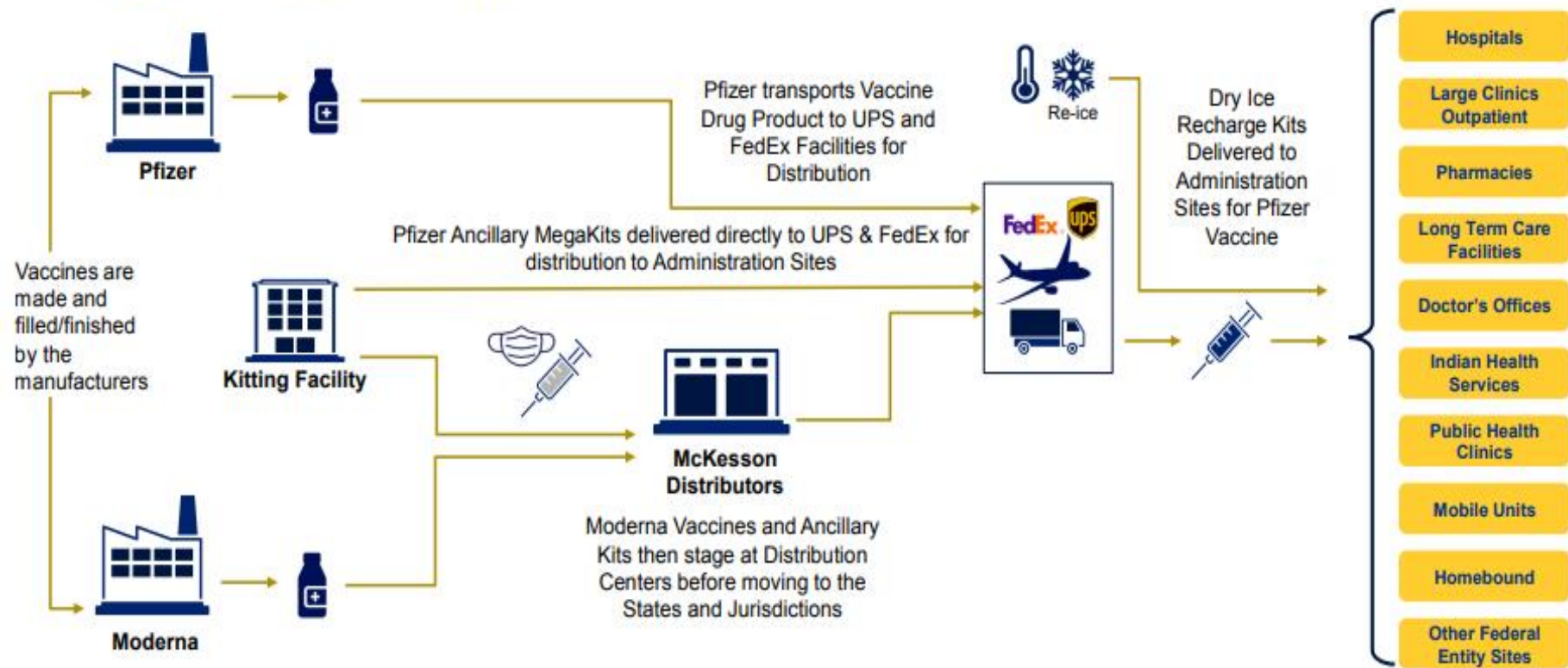

| Phase 2 | <ul style="list-style-type: none">First responders (fire, police, national guard)Teachers/school staff, childcare providersPublic Health workersOther essential frontline workers that regularly interact with publicOther long-term care residents and those living in other congregate settingsIndividuals in general population deemed particularly high risk due to comorbidities and health conditions |
| Phase 3 | <ul style="list-style-type: none">Individuals over 65Individuals under 65 with high-risk comorbidities and health conditions |
| Phase 4 | <ul style="list-style-type: none">All other essential workers |
| Phase 5 | <ul style="list-style-type: none">Healthy adults and children |

Phase 1a

- Healthcare workers (clinical and non-clinical) in patient care settings (ICU, ED, EMS top priority)
 - Subsequent document states prioritize based on uncontrolled exposure, direct covid 19 care, aerosolization procedures
 - Divide each area by 1/3, and include 55+ in the first 1/3
- Long-term care facility workers who regularly interact with residents
- Most at-risk long-term care facility patients
- State later included ambulatory clinics and home care in 1a

Kaleida Health Priority Matrix -1A

- High risk employees
- Front line employees, volunteers, vendors, and students
- Patient facing staff in the hospitals
- Kaleida affiliated healthcare ambulatory providers

Beginning January 11, 2021 Eligible New Yorkers in Phase 1b: **(combination and modification of phase 2 and 3)**

- Individuals Age 75 and older
- First Responders and Support Staff for First Responder Agency
- P-12 Schools
- Licensed, registered, approved or legally exempt group Childcare Providers
- Public Transit
- Individuals living in a homeless shelter
- Public-facing grocery store workers
- In-person college instructors
